The downtown Olympia Farmers Market offers more than local crafts, meat and produce. For eight years now folks have been drawn to the market to meet with intuitive and psychic palm reader Amelia Romoff. On sunny summer weekends you will find her sitting outside the tranquil market garden with the fragrance of wisteria wafting through the air and an open palm before her.

Amelia, who believes in self-determination, says the lines on our palms represent how we are feeling at any given moment. She believes that, like our experience of reality, our palm lines are created by the combined power of our beliefs and our emotions. “I’ve watched the lines change even as I’m doing a reading,” she said in a recent interview. “They respond to changing thought.”

In addition to examining palm lines, Amelia uses extrasensory perceptions to help her customers navigate their spiritual path. “When I was a little kid I would go up to people and tell them things I thought they needed to know,” she said, “and they would usually

get mad at me. Then, when I was eight years old, I met a palm reader at a gathering and saw that by looking at a person's palm she could give them helpful information without making them angry."

Amelia, who offers readings for \$1 per minute for up to twenty minutes and private sessions for \$100, compares her psychic talent to peeling an onion. "The first layer, which is about seeing a person's past and who they are in general, is the easiest to read," she said, "although for some reason it is the one that seems to shock and amaze people." After revealing a person's outer layer, Amelia says she can focus on the deeper levels of one's being, which involve how we create our perception of reality based on our own thoughts, beliefs and judgments. "Spiritual growth is always about taking responsibility for our perceptions," she said. "It is always about working through our issues, acceptance and release."

If you are interested in peeling back some of your own layers, visit Amelia at the Olympia Farmers Market between 10am and 3pm one sunny, summer weekend. (She recommends you arrive before noon, as she gets busy towards the end of the day.)
